She proposes that all women sign the form below with their name and address and send it to her with two penny stamps for the badge of membership. Address: letters: Baroness Orczy, Snowfield, Bearsted, Kent; and mark envelopes W.E.A.S.L.: At this hour of England's grave peril and desperate need I do hereby pledge myself most solemnly in the name of my King and country to persuade every man I know to offer his services to his country, and I also pledge myself never to be seen in public with any man who being in every way fit and free for service has refused to respond to his country's call.
